Explanation of Health Services Forms

There are several health forms required by the State of Illinois and the School District. They are as follows:

1. Certificate of Child Health Examination
2. Health Emergency Form
3. Permission Form to Administer Medication

**Certificate of Child Health Examination**

1. Incoming freshmen students must present a current physical examination dated within 12 months of the first day of school. **Students who do not meet these requirements will be excluded from school as of October 15, 2012.**
2. Please remember to **complete** the "Health History" and **sign** the form **prior** to your appointment with your health care provider.
3. If your child/ward is interested in **participating in athletics**, an additional copy of the Certificate of Child Health Examination must be submitted along with the Athletic Clearance forms **to the Athletics Department**. The Athletic Clearance forms can be found in the summer edition of *The Minuteman* magazine as well as on-line.

**Health Emergency Form**

**Your signature is required to treat and release information in the event of an emergency.**

**Permission Form to Administer Medication  
(Prescription or Over-the-counter)**

**A student may carry an inhaler and Epi-pen as needed, but all other medications, including over-the-counter medications, must be administered by the school nurse.**

For any medication (prescription and/or over-the-counter) to be given at school, the **"Permission Form to Administer Medication"** must be on file with the school nurse. The form needs to be **signed by the parent/guardian and** then by the **health care provider**. Parent/Guardian must bring prescription medication to school in a current pharmacy-labeled container. We have over the counter medicine here at school.

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Certificate of Child Health Examination Immunization Information</b></p>

The Illinois School Code and Department of Health requires the following immunizations for all students:

- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DTaP):
  - Must have received 3 or more doses of DPT or DT with the last dose being a booster on or after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- Tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis (Tdap):
  - Booster due every 10 years. Pertussis has been added recently due to the outbreak in adolescents and adults.
- Poliomyelitis (OPV or IPV):
  - Must have a primary series of 2 or 3 doses, plus one booster after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR):
  - Two doses required: the first dose must be after the first birthday, and the 2<sup>nd</sup> no less than 1 month later. May be broken into individual vaccines.
    - **Measles:** proof of disease verified by a doctor is an acceptable alternative to a vaccination.
    - **Rubella:** laboratory evidence of a titer is acceptable. History of having disease is not acceptable proof of immunity.
    - **Mumps:** vaccine required. Must have dose after 1<sup>st</sup> birthday. Proof of immunity from doctor is acceptable.
- Hepatitis B series
  - Series of 3 injections is required for all students, 28 days between #1 and #2, two months between #2 and #3, four months between #1 and #3.
- Tuberculosis (TB) skin test
  - Mantoux method. Not a vaccine. Although not required, it is recommended for all incoming freshmen students.
- Varicella (chicken pox):
  - Varicella Vaccine on or after the first birthday or proof of varicella disease which includes; Varicella disease verified with the month and year of illness signed by Physician or health care provider; or Laboratory evidence of Varicella immunity.
