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

# Large Class Ensembles

Our large class performing ensembles are the cornerstone of our program, performing a wide range of traditional and modern literature. All band students are assigned a class based on a yearly performance assessment each May. Yearly performances include the fall, winter, and spring concerts. Ensembles include the following:

- Freshman Band
- Concert Band
- Symphonic Band
- Advanced Symphonic Band
- Honor Band (Freshman are not eligible for this ensemble)

# Marching Band

The Marching Band is a co-curricular group within the Stevenson Band program. Participation in Marching Band is optional for band students, however, in order to be eligible, members must be registered for a large class ensemble. Those who participate in Marching Band are eligible to receive a one semester P.E. waiver each year they participate. Read the Marching Band section in this brochure for more information.

# Pep Band

Pep Band is a volunteer ensemble that performs at 12 varsity boys and girls basketball games each year. All students in grades 9-12 who are members of the Band are eligible to participate.





# Jazz Program

The jazz program at Stevenson High School consists of six co-curricular groups: four large ensembles and two jazz combos. Placement in a jazz group is determined by an audition the beginning of the school year. Any instrument can be played in Lab Band, one of our large ensembles, but all other groups use traditional jazz instrumentation. All jazz groups have regular performances at school and in the community throughout the year.



# **Small Ensembles**

Small ensembles are co-curricular groups open to all band students (grades 9-12) who are enrolled in a large class ensemble. These ensembles meet one to two times per week, either before or after school from September through April. The ensembles perform at various events throughout the year. Ensembles include:

### Private Lessons

While not required, it is highly recommended that all band students sign up for supplemental private music lessons.

Weekly lessons are offered on all instruments with professional music instructors from around the greater Chicago area.



# Color Guard and Winter Guard





### Color Guard

Color Guard is a co-curricular group that is open to all Stevenson High students grade 9-12. No previous experience is required—all are welcome. In the fall, the Color Guard performs as a section of the Stevenson High School Marching Band.

### **Winter Guard**

In the winter, members may continue to perform as members of the Winter Guard, a competitive performance group. The Color Guard and Winter Guard rehearse two to upon their performance schedule.

### **Auditions**

All band students are eligible and encouraged to consider auditioning for the Color Guard program. There is no dance or other experience necessary. There will be a two three times a week depending week workshop each spring followed by a brief tryout for

# Marching Band

The first performance with the Marching Band is typically at the end of the second week of school. By this time, pregame and halftime shows are fully prepared. These shows include: learning and memorizing music, learning drill, and learning multiple stands' tunes to play during the game.

Summer practices are an essential part of preparing students for these performances, and play a critical role in ensuring long-term success for the band throughout the season. Because of this, student attendance at these practices is critical. Once the school year begins, practices drop significantly with a minimal time commitment relative to other school activities.







# Academics

Our band students perform exceptionally well in the classroom. We encourage students to engage in rigorous courses and to explore their interests. # Band Placement Benchmark Audition for Incoming Freshman Students

In order to enroll in band at Stevenson, all incoming freshman students must complete the Band Placement Benchmark Audition in one of the following ways:

Important Note: Students should only complete one level of audition materials.

If you chose the optional Level 2 Audition, you do not need to complete the Level 1 Audition.

# OPTION 1 Level 1: Benchmark Freshman Band Placement

### Step 1

Register for Freshman Band when signing up for classes in the spring of your eighth grade year. For most students, this will be the class you take as a freshman.

### Step 2

See your middle school band director for audition materials.
All students seeking Freshman Band placement will
need to play the Level 1 Audition. This includes:

- Student Selected Scales (major)
- Assigned Études

### Step 3: Audition

This will take place during your band class at your middle school in the spring of your eighth grade year.

## OPTION 2

Level 2: Advanced Symphonic Band, Symphonic Band and Concert Band Placement\*

#### Step 1

Register for Freshman Band when signing up for classes in the spring of your eighth grade year. For most students, this will be the class you take as a freshman.

### Step 2

Complete the Online Registration at www.d125.org/arts/band.

Any student seeking placement into Concert Band must play the Level 1 Audition. This includes: etude provided by the SHS Band Directors, provided scale sheet, and sight reading. Any student seeking placement into Advanced Symphonic Band or Symphonic Band must play the Level 2 Audition. This includes: excerpts from the coming year's ILMEA High School All-State Études, provided scale sheet, and sight reading.

### Step 3

Once all of the requests for auditions are in, you will receive an email with your audition music, as well as the date and time that you will be required to play.

### Step 4: Audition

This will take place at Stevenson High School outside of the school day in the spring of your eighth grade year.

### **Drumline Auditions**

All percussion students will be asked to perform a placement audition in the spring of their eighth grade year. Materials will be given out at your middle school in early spring each year regarding audition requirements, dates and times (see above). All Marching Band assignments will be determined by a separate audition in May.

## Final Band Placement

Students will be notified of their final band placement by the end of the spring of their eighth grade year. Final placement will be determined by the benchmark audition, teacher recommendation, and instrumentation.

\* Choosing the Level 2 Audition does not guarantee that you will be selected for an advanced ensemble. Students who are placed in these ensembles must meet a minimum number of performance criteria before being considered.

# Registering for Band

### **Band Class**

Band at Stevenson High School is an accredited course that meets for a full period each day.

#### P.E. Waiver

Students who participate in Marching Band may waive the P.E. requirement for the fall semester of that school year.

### **Scheduling World History**

World History may be taken during sophomore year or during summer school before or after freshman year, making up to 30 semester credits available for electives.

### **Summer School**

Many band students take advantage of Stevenson's rapidly expanding summer school offerings to make room for more electives during the regular school year. For more information see the sample schedules on the following page.


### Credit

All band courses earn regular credit that is counted in the student's grade point average (GPA). Seniors who have been in the band program for three years may receive accelerated-level credit if they are in the Honor Band during their senior year.



# **BPO Committees**

**Executive Board.** Oversee all aspects of the BPO organization. These are elected positions voted upon by the BPO membership.

**Band Camp.** Organize the Rookie Ice Cream Social and Color Warz during band camp.

**Benefit Days.** Schedule restaurant fundraiser nights throughout the year.

**Color Guard/Winter Guard.** Support the guards and be the liaison between band and guards.

**Communications.** Responsible for all BPO communications to include the website and email correspondence.

**Concessions.** Work the concession stand during football and basketball games.

**Fundraising.** Work with the directors to raise funds for the BPO program for student travel and BPO business related expenses.

**Hospitality.** Set up, serve refreshments, and clean up at concerts and other events.

**Newcomers.** Coordinate, recruit and train new parents to the BPO organization.

**Parent Power.** Recruit volunteers and help the band directors wherever needed, such as assisting in transportation, securing equipment, or just lending a helping hand.

**Patriot Cards.** Organize the distribution of Patriot Cards and collection of funds raised.

**Photography.** Take pictures or videos of band events. Manage multi-media website.

**Sign-up Genius.** Responsible for maintaining the sign-up genius website with up to date volunteer opportunities.

**Spirit wear.** Process and distribute spirit wear orders in the fall.

**Student Accounts.** Work with the BPO Treasurer to maintain student accounts for travel.

**Uniforms and Formal Wear.** Organize, distribute, collect, and have cleaned, all marching uniforms and concert formal wear.
