- Email from CCC went out 1st week of school re: how to sign up
- Visit the CCC website for sign-up details
 - Sign up in Naviance
 - At least 2 school days in advance

- Research colleges and admissions data
- Record your applications in the "Colleges" tab
- Add "Colleges I'm Thinking About" for upcoming visit notifications
- Record your admission decisions
- Keep abreast of all college opportunities

- Go to www.commonapp.org
- Go to www.coalitionforcollegeaccess.org
 - U of Washington (Seattle) only accepts Coalition App

NOTE: A college may have more than one way to apply. Choose Only One.

Applications How to Apply

- Check college's website
- Track user names/passwords
- Track application status
- Meet deadlines
- Distinguish Early Decision vs. Early Action vs. Regular Decision
- Inform others how to support you in a timely fashion

Transcripts *Review Before Sending*

- © Check your transcript on Infinite Campus
- Verify that you are on track to complete all graduation requirements
- Verify Driver's Education completion

- www.parchment.com
- Common App or Coalition App
- Self-report

- Use Parchment when your transcript is not otherwise being reported via...
 - Common App
 - Coalition App
 - Self-report

Transcripts Common Application

- Go to Recommender page on Common App
- Invite your counselor to be a recommender (invite as "Counselor")
- Counselor will submit transcript

Transcripts Coalition Application

- Invite your counselor to be a recommender
- Counselor will submit transcript

Transcripts Self-reporting

- Access your transcript in Infinite Campus and entergrades yourself
- Send a final transcript in June via Parchment
- U Illinois, U Iowa, Illinois State, U of California, U Minnesota, U Nebraska, Northern Illinois, Iowa State, U Kansas, among others, use self-reporting

Transcripts Please Note

Current senior year courses are listed on transcript

Resend transcript to reflect any senior year schedule changes

Recommendation Letters Do Your Research/Plan Ahead

- Is it required?
- Ask early
 - Minimum 3 WEEKS notice = no later than mid-September
- Teachers can say "no"

Recommendation Letters Do I Need One?

- Check the college's application checklist
- Many colleges do <u>NOT</u> want rec letters (e.g., UIUC)
- Adhere to the minimum. If college asks for one or two, one is sufficient.

Recommendation Letters Teacher Letter vs Counselor Letter

- What is the purpose?
 - Counselor your overall development through high school
 - Teacher your academic functioning/learning
- There are two forms
 - Counselor "Brag Sheet"
 - Teacher Reflection Form

Recommendation Letters Where to Find "Brag Sheets"

- ⊗ Go to d125.org
- Click on "Students"
- Click on "Forms/Documents"
 - Counselor Recommendation Form/"Brag Sheet"
 - Teacher Letter of Recommendation Reflection Sheet

Recommendation Letters The Counselor Letter

- Schedule an appointment with your counselor at least 3 weeks prior to your deadline
- Complete your "brag sheet" thoughtfully and thoroughly
- The more specific examples of your awesomeness, the stronger the letter

Essays *Tips*

- Answer the essay question
- "Optional" essays are NOT optional (write!)
- Demonstrate genuine interest in that school
- Mighlight what makes you unique
- If there was a problem, don't hide it; explain it
 - UIUC has additional essay options for "Academic Challenges" if any apply to you

Essays *Resources*

- Use one source to help you ('too many cooks spoil the broth')
 - Post-secondary counselors in the CCC
 - ILC tutors
 - Your counselor
 - Teachers

Test Scores

- © Check admissions' website for 2020 test requirements
- If required...
 - Order official scores at <u>www.act.org</u> or <u>www.collegeboard.org</u>
 - Some colleges now allow you to self-report

Deadlines

- October 15
 - Public universities
 - Any early admission plan
- November 30
 - Other 4-year institutions
- March 1
 - CLC
 - Other 2-year schools
- May 1
 - National Reply Day

Deadlines *Procrastinators Beware!*

November 1


