### THE COACHES



Violist Emma Strohbusch is an experienced orchestral and chamber musician, committed to sharing music with audiences and students. She performs with orchestras including New Philharmonic, Northwest Indiana Symphony, and Rockford Symphony, and has contributed to many U.S. and world premiers with the Chicago Composers Orchestra. She performs with chamber music ensembles, including Lincolnwood Chamber Orchestra, and at private and religious events in the Chicago area.

Emma has worked with Stevenson students as ensemble coach and audition judge since 2018. She is on faculty at Noteable Notes Music Academy,

Kagan and Gaines Music, First Conservatory La Grange, and is orchestra director at Prairie School of Dupage. Emma earned her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Music Performance at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign and Roosevelt University Chicago College of Performing Arts. She was also a recipient of the Edward J. Krolick String Award – a full-tuition scholarship. Emma has studied with artists including Michael Isaac Strauss (Indianapolis Quartet), Philip Ying (Ying Quartet), Roger Chase (Roosevelt University), Joanna Mendoza (Arianna Quartet), and Evelina Chao (St. Paul Chamber Orchestra).



As the child of two working classical musicians, Morgan Little has been attending rehearsals from a very young age. Born in Los Angeles, Morgan started his training exclusively as a modern cellist. Morgan caught the bug of historical performance while studying at DePaul University in Chicago, and has not recovered since. After a short stint in Boston, he continued his studies as a full-tuition scholarship student at the Juilliard School, where he maintained an active role as a chamber and orchestral musician, recently playing principal cellist with Juilliard

415 on tour in Scandinavia under the direction of David Hill, and playing continuo for the Juilliard production of Dido and Aeneas in New York, London, and Versailles under the direction of Avi Stein. Morgan enjoys playing all kinds of cello and Viola da Gamba in Chicago, and hopes to use the knowledge he has acquired to find his place in the musical world.



Renee Henley is a graduate of Northwestern University with both a Bachelors and Masters Degree in Violin Performance. After beginning private lessons at a young age, she joined the community orchestra at the age of 8 and has continued playing in orchestral ensembles ever since. Her performance schedule is kept full with concerts of all forms from musical pits, opera orchestras, quartets and full orchestra performances. She regularly performs with regional orchestras, including the Fort Wayne Philharmonic and Orchestra Iowa. In addition, she is a tenured member of the Quad City Symphony

Orchestra and has a full studio of private lessons, many of which are taught at Stevenson through the PREP program.



A native of Lviv, Ukraine, cellist **Nazar Dzhuryn** graduated from Lviv Music School, where he studied with Evgeny Shpitzer, and he earned his Master of Music degree at Moscow State Conservatory under Prof. Igor Gavrysh. Nazar taught at the Moscow Conservatory as assistant professor before moving to Chicago in 1998. Since then, Nazar's career has been filled with chamber coaching, private teaching, solo performances, and studio recordings.

Nazar is the assistant principal cello of the Elgin Symphony Orchestra, and the principal cello of Woodstock Mozart Festival Orchestra. He has been featured as a soloist and given master

classes with various symphonies, philharmonic orchestras, and festivals in France, South America, Russia, Ukraine, South Korea, Croatia, Zagreb, and the United States. His solo recitals for Dame Myra Hess Memorial Concerts and the PianoForte Salon Series have been broadcast live on 98.7 WFMT. He has also released recordings featuring works by Reger, Kodaly, Ysaye, Hindemith, Ligeti, Crumb and Laniuk.

He is currently a member of the music faculty at Northeastern Illinois University at Naperville School for the Performing Arts. Both at the school, and in his privately maintained studios in Chicago and Elgin, he has coached chamber ensembles for the Chicago Youth Symphony Orchestra (CYSO) and students who have been successful in numerous competitions.
